At The Shropshire Golf Club, we are very proud of our Junior Section where we, under our SAFEGOLF accreditation, actively encourage both boys and girls to participate in the sport. Children of ages 5 through to 18 are given the opportunity to develop their skills from beginner to County level during organised coaching sessions.

3. THE RELATIONHIP BETWEEN THE GOLF CENTRE AND THE GOLF CLUB

We feel it is useful for Members to understand how the Golf Centre and Golf Club work together for the benefit of Golf Club Members. It's a very close and mutually supportive relationship.

This relationship means that the Golf Club operates differently from private member golf clubs that own their own course and associated facilities. At The Shropshire, the golf course, practice facilities and club house are owned and operated by Burhill Golf and Leisure Limited part of Burhill Group Limited (BGL), a private company owned by members of the Guinness family, which operates several similar Golf Centres and Golf Clubs in the UK, including the prestigious Burhill Golf Club at Walton-on-Thames in Surrey.

The Golf Centre (BGL) is responsible for:

- The maintenance of the course and practice facilities.
- The running of the club house (including the bar, restaurant, and conference facilities).
- · The collection of membership and affiliation fees.
- All aspects of Health and Safety on the premises.
- Booking of tee times for Golf Club Members, guests, visitors, and societies.
- · The Pro Shop.
- · Providing facilities for the Golf Club to use.

The Golf Centre is managed by the Centre Manager and his team.

The Golf Club Committee is responsible for working with the Golf Centre to provide:

- A handicapping system in line with the World Handicapping System (WHS).
- A set of competitions for Members of the Golf Club.
- Local Rules that comply with the R&A rules of Golf.
- Affiliation with the Shropshire and Herefordshire Union of Golf Clubs (SHUGC) or Shropshire Ladies County Golf Association.

The Golf Centre and Golf Club work in tandem in respect of the Club Constitution, a Policy for Equality, Diversity & Inclusion, and Disciplinary Regulations.

The Committee Members, a proportion of whom are elected by the membership to serve a 3-year term, are detailed earlier in this booklet.

The relationship is that the Golf Centre is dependent on the Golf Club to provide a consistent and stable base of income and the Golf Club is dependent on the Golf Centre to allow it to use the Golf Centre facilities. In this respect, there is a reciprocal relationship in which a profit-making organisation and a not-forprofit organisation must work closely together for mutual benefit.

The Golf Club recognises that the Golf Centre is a business that exists to make a profit, and the Golf Centre recognises that the Golf Club will have requirements that are not provided to non-members. Both share a common objective to provide an environment in which people of all abilities, and from all walks of life, can enjoy their golf free of harassment and where everyone is always treated with dignity and respect.

As such, it is a special relationship built on a common understanding and acceptance of each party's needs. However, the Golf Centre and BGL have legal obligations and financial objectives meaning that the Golf Centre management has to have over-arching authority over everything that takes place within its facilities that could affect its wider responsibilities.

The Golf Centre management and the Golf Club Committee are committed to a positive and long-term relationship for the benefit of both parties. This is built on an environment of open communication where any plans or potential issues are discussed at the earliest possible moment.

Courtesy golf for BGL Members

- Members receive free golf at any other BGL club/centre (up to 12 rounds per year) excluding Burhill Golf Club which is limited to one round per year.
- Thornbury Lodge Members can benefit from discounted stay and play rates. Subject to availability.

Terms and conditions:

- Valid Monday Friday and after the first off peak tee time at weekends, except for Burhill Golf Club where bookings are Monday – Thursday only.
- · Booking window equivalent to that of visitors.
- Free golf allocation excludes golf day bookings. Maximum one tee time. Discounts may apply for BGL members booking golf days at other clubs/centres.
- Free golf can be withdrawn at any time and is always subject to availability.
- The General Manager of the visiting club's decision is final.
- Excludes Flexible membership.

Booking procedure:

All bookings must be made via the Pro Shop or General Manager.

4. NEW MEMBERS INFORMATION

At The Shropshire Golf Club, we are keen to make all members welcome and making sure they feel a part of the golf club as quickly as possible.

5. RULES OF GOLF

The most recent changes to the Rules of Golf became effective on 1st Jan 2023.All golfers should try and familiarise themselves with the rules, and perhaps it is worth memorising Rule 1 which sets out the fundamental principles of the game for players:

- Play the course as you find it: This means that golfers should navigate the course based on its existing conditions, including the lie of the ball, the terrain, and any obstacles.
- Play the ball as it lies: Golfers must play the ball from wherever it comes to rest, without altering its position or conditions.
- Adhere to the Rules: Players are required to follow the official Rules of Golf. Ignoring or changing the rules is not allowed.
- Embrace the spirit of the game: Honesty, integrity, and sportsmanship are
 essential aspects of golf. Always play with fairness and respect for
 opponents and the game itself.

Remember, Rule 1 applies to all levels of play whether you're playing a casual round with friends or competing in professional competitions & tournaments.

Player Responsibility for Applying the Rules.

Honest Application of Penalties: Players must be honest in applying their own penalties. If a player knows they have breached a rule that involves a penalty and deliberately fails to apply the penalty, they are disqualified.

In essence, golfers are accountable for their actions on the course, ensuring fair play and maintaining the integrity of the game.

You are expected to recognise when you have knowingly breached a Rule and to be honest in applying your own penalties. You may ask for help with the Rules from a referee or the Committee, but if help is not available in a reasonable time you must play on and raise the issue later.

There are times when you must make estimates, such as the spot where to replace your ball, the point where your ball crossed the edge of a penalty area or when taking relief under the Rules. You are expected to consider all available information and to make a reasonable judgment in the circumstances.

A penalty applies to you when a breach of a Rule results from your own actions, the actions of your caddie, or the actions of another person acting with your authority or knowledge.

Penalties are meant to cancel out any potential advantage. There are three main penalty levels:

- One-Stroke Penalty: Applies in both match play and stroke play.
- General Penalty: Loss of hole in match play and a two-stroke penalty in stroke play.
- Disqualification: Applies both in match play and stroke play.

If a player knows that he or she has breached a Rule that involves a penalty and deliberately fails to apply the penalty, the player is **disqualified**.

If two or more players deliberately agree to ignore any Rule or penalty they know applies and any of those players have started the round, they are **disqualified** (even if they have not yet acted on the agreement).

There is no differentiation in the above rules extract regarding different types of players (Men, Ladies, Seniors, Juniors, Members or Visitors) or different sizes of groups (4 ball, 3 ball, 2 ball or 1 ball).

If it is known that a group behind is playing in a competition and the group in front is playing a friendly game, the group behind should be waived through at the earliest opportunity, if waiting to play.

6. LOCAL RULES

The Golf Club operates under the auspices of the Royal and Ancient (R&A) and England Golf (EG) particularly in relation to playing matters. The Golf Club cannot change the rules of golf but can introduce additional rules ('Local Rules') that relate to local playing conditions and issue additional guidelines to Members and visitors when playing.

The introduction of Local Rules at The Shropshire Golf Club is the responsibility of the Committee. They are posted in full on the notice board and where appropriate are summarised on the Score Card.

Temporary local rules for specific periods or individual competitions (e.g., related to course condition) may be introduced and notified on the Notice Board or on Competition Rules Sheet displayed on the day of the competition.

It is recommended that Members familiarise themselves with ALL the Local Rules because knowing them can be to a player's advantage but not knowing them can lead to penalties!

7. PLAYING GUIDELINES & CARE OF THE COURSE

General tee times and bookings for BYOT competitions are made either via the shop or the Elites Live App. Tees are available to Members online from 7pm 10 days in advance. Members must check in at the Golf Shop before commencing play on any course.

Bookings for Club Competitions can either be made on the PSi screens or via 'How Did I Do' and are usually open for entry 10 days before each competition.

Slow Play

Players should play without delay, when ready a stroke should be made within 40 seconds. No player should play until those in front are out of range. Players searching for a ball should signal those behind them to play through as soon as it becomes apparent that the ball will not be easily found; they should not search for three minutes before doing so. Always play a provisional if you think maybe difficult to find.

Bunkers

Before leaving a bunker, players should carefully and smooth over all holes and footprints made by them and any nearby made by others. If a rake is available, please use it.

Repair of Divots & Pitch Marks

Players should carefully repair any divot holes made by them and any damage to the putting green made by the impact of a ball (whether or not made by the player).

Preventing Unnecessary Damage

Players should avoid causing damage to the course when taking practice swings. To avoid damaging the hole take care during the handling of the flagstick and the removing the ball from the hole. The head of a putter should not be used to remove a hall from the hole.

Trolleys and Buggies

Centre notices regulating the use of buggies and trolleys must be strictly observed. Trolleys and Buggies should not be taken between green and greenside bunkers to prevent excessive wear adjacent to the greens.

Roped off Areas

During the winter months and at various times throughout the year the groundkeeper will rope off areas of the course to prevent access by buggies and trolleys. Trolleys and buggies <u>must not</u> be taken into these areas.

Winter Approved Wheels

During the winter the Golf Centre may require the use of hedgehog or other approved winter wheels. This will be posted on the notice board. You should check with the Pro Shop to see which are approved.

8. THE WORLD HANDICAP SYSTEM (WHS)

The aim of the World Handicap System (WHS) is to create a consistent and fair way to calculate handicaps across different golf courses and regions. This section provides some basic information about (WHS) that you need to know.

Initial Handicap - to obtain a handicap index in the first instance new members must complete 54 holes in any combination of 18 and 9-hole rounds at the Shropshire in the company of a player who holds an official WHS handicap, preferably a Shropshire Club member. Once completed all your completed cards should then be placed in an envelope marked with your name and titled for Handicap and placed in the "Correspondence box" in the club house. You will then be allocated an initial Handicap Index and be eligible to play in the club competitions subject to the individual competition rules.

New Members from another club - please note it is the Player's responsibility to provide the Handicap Committee with your ID (CDH) number.

Before Your Round

Once you have decided which tees you are going to play, you must convert your Handicap Index into a Course Handicap. The conversion process is easy and can be done by using a look-up table located near the first tee, your Club software or a mobile app.

Depending on the format of play, a handicap allowance may be applied to your Course Handicap. E.g. the recommended handicap allowance for individual Stroke Play events is 95%, which means a player could have a Course Handicap of 15 and a Playing Handicap of 14.

During The Round - Understand the concept of Net Double Bogey: For any hole where you score worse than Net Double Bogey, you'll receive a Net Double Bogey score.

After the Round - Submit your score in accordance with Club procedures as soon as possible after you have completed your round. It must be certified by a marker.

Each time you submit a new Competitions or General Play scorecard, your Handicap Index can change. A newly submitted score becomes part of your 20 most recent rounds. If this new score is among your best eight or pushes out one of your current best eight, it will affect your Handicap Index.

Consistently playing well or poorly affects your Handicap Index. A series of good scores will lower it, while a string of poor scores will raise it. However, WHS uses a trending calculation to smooth out sudden changes.

Remember that your Handicap Index reflects your current playing ability, and it's a dynamic value that adapts as you improve or face challenges on the golf course. If a score produces a score differential that is 7.0 strokes or better than your Handicap Index at the time the round is played, it is subject to an exceptional score reduction.

At the end of each day, a playing conditions calculation (PCC) takes place automatically, behind the scenes, to determine if scores made at the course were significantly higher or lower than expected. If scores were unusually low or high, a PCC adjustment between –1 and +3 will be applied to your score differential calculation to reflect the playing conditions on the day.

WHS - Non-Returned (NR) Cards

One of the principles of the World Handicapping System (WHS) is that players' Handicap Indexes reflect their demonstrated playing ability. For this to be the case, players should return every Competition card and every card where they have pre-registered to submit a card under General Play.

By signing up to play in a competition or general play round, it is your responsibility to return a score without undue delay. Players who do not return a card without informing the Handicap Committee are likely to receive a penalty score on their playing record.

WHS Handicap Reviews

The World Handicap System (WHS)recommends that golf clubs conduct an annual handicap review for all members. The annual review takes place between 1st October and 31st December. The aim of the review is to assess whether a player's Handicap Index accurately reflects their demonstrated ability and whether their current scoring pattern aligns with their expected scoring pattern.

The Handicap Review Report from the WHS platform provides insights into players whose Handicap Index may require further consideration by the Committee. Remember that the ultimate decision on adjustments lies with the Handicap Committee, taking into account additional information about each player's performance and ability.

If you have any specific questions about your own handicap, please contact the Handicap Committee for guidance.

WHS Handicaps

Players also need to ensure they have paid the SHUGC annual fees, or their handicap index will be withdrawn.

CASUAL ROUNDS, SOCIAL AND GENERAL PLAY SCORES

The World Handicap System now allows golfers to register scores for handicapping purposes during a general play round. Acceptable scores include those played with friends, colleagues and in societies.

It is not compulsory, if you just want a social round, having "gimmies" etc., this is fine. If only 1 or 2 of the group wants to put in a score, that is fine also, but the scores submitted must be:

- In an authorized format of play
- Over a minimum number of holes (9 or 18)
- By the Rules of Golf
- In the company of at least one other person or player (subject to satisfying other Rules of Golf requirements)
- Play over a tee set with a current Course RatingTM and Slope RatingTM,

Please, remember your "Player Responsibilities" laid down by WHS. In particular "Submit acceptable scores to provide reasonable evidence of their demonstrated ability." The more scores you submit the more accurately your Handicap Index represents your true ability.

How do I submit a General Play score? whether at home or visiting another club?

Pre-register your round, Golfers with a Handicap Index® must declare their intention to submit a score. This can be done via the England Golf or HDID apps, or through the PSI screens located in the golf club.

Play and enjoy the round in accordance with the Rules of Golf. Enter your gross scores for each hole score using the using the same system you signed in with e.g. PSI screen or HowdidIdo App.

Electronic returns of scores have the same status as physical scorecards and must be attested by the marker who witnessed the round. Players submitting a physical scores card should enter their score into the HDID system and return the signed scorecard with markers signature into the competitions box located under the main PSI screen

If you do sign in and then do not start or finish the round, you must have a good reason. If this is due to an injury, illness of major family issue then you must notify the Handicap Chair who will remove this from your record. However, if you just had a bad day and walk off the course without entering a score then a Penalty score will be applied.

You can also now submit general play scores directly via the My England Golf App. However, your marker must also have an ID number (CDH number). Your hole-by-hole scores will be emailed to your marker, who will verify your score before it can be accepted.

Please note, when using the MyEG app to submit a general score the following details will be active in order to protect the integrity of the handicap system:

- Geo-location technology ensures pre-registering the intent to post a score can only be done in close proximity to the course where the round will take place.
- A time lag will be in operation from the point where intent to play a round is registered to the stage when a score can be accepted.
- A golfer's final score must be verified by a playing partner who has witnessed the round and who holds a World Handicap System handicap index.
- GPS will check that you are at that course when signing in and submitting
 a score so you must be within a short distance of the club, don't delay
 submitting your score until you get home.

Submitting 9-hole scores

To add a general 9-hole score to your record you will need to pre-register the intention to post a 9-hole round before teeing off. If you set off for 18 holes but fail to finish you must play at least 10 holes for that score to count towards handicapping.

9. CLUB COMPETITIONS

Entering Competitions:

Members must have a valid active Membership Number. Start sheets/Tee times for Club Competitions are available on the club notice boards or the PSI screens or HowDidIDo (HDID). Competitions will be open to enter via the PSI screen or HDID 10 days before each competition and then close 3 days prior to the competition date. Entry into the competition after this point may still be possible but must be made via the Pro Shop.

Entry Criteria:

Boarded competitions have the following entry criteria for Stroke Play and Knockouts.

Members must have a WHS Handicap index to be eligible to win any competition and will need to have played in at least 3 Home Club Competitions (not General Play) in the preceding 12-month period as a prerequisite for entry to the Club Championships and Knockout Competitions. New members can still enter the Knockout Competitions if they have joined no more than 6 months prior to the draw.

In accordance with the guidelines issued by our County Unions, unless otherwise stated in individual Competition Rules, the maximum Playing Handicap for Stroke Play will be 28 for Men and 36 for Ladies. Members with higher Playing Handicaps may still enter the competition/s but their Playing Handicaps will be capped at the appropriate gender upper limit.

Entry Fees:

To stay in line with the centre and our pay before play policy payments for competitions need to be made via our card reader in the pro shop, before any play commences, for entries to count.

The Winter and Summer knockout competitions will continue to be BACS and cash entries until further notice. We still **require payments for the knockout competitions must be paid before the draw.**

Withdrawing or changing your tee time:

Please respect your playing partners. If you need to withdraw from a competition within 24 hours, you should contact your playing partners, the Pro Shop and, if possible, a Competitions Committee Member in order that alternative playing arrangements can be made.

Any member judged not to have honoured a competition booking and who does not have a valid reason for their' no show', the following action may be taken.

- 1st occurrence a reminder of policy will be issued.
- 2nd occurrence for a period of 35 days, Members will not be permitted to play in any competitions (this excludes the Knock-Out competitions).

On the day:

- All Members playing in club competitions must register and pay the relevant entry fee prior to play and sign in via PSi screen or HDID.
- All Members playing in a club competition must return a scorecard signed by the player and marker on completion of their round ensuring that the Player's Name is clearly identifiable in the appropriate manner.
- All Members on completing a round in a club competition must enter their score via the PSi screens or HDID (when required).
- Failure to adhere to the above may result in the player being deemed not to have satisfied competition entry rules and maybe excluded from future competitions.

On the Course and in the Club House:

All Members are kindly requested to always follow any on course instructions of The Shropshire Golf Centre staff and:

- Maintain a good pace of play.
- Repair all pitch marks.
- Rake bunkers after use.
- Replace all divots.
- Replace, when removed, 150yd markers and penalty area markers.
- DO NOT remove or move wooden winter posts and ropes (see Local Rules).

All questions relating to playing golf competitions, handicaps, county books, competition prizes, entry fees to club competitions, winter rules and rules in competitions should be addressed to a Committee Member.

Please respect your fellow Members, club officers, centre staff and visitors at all times. Foul and abusive language is not acceptable at any time. Any failure to comply with competition rules or club etiquette will be investigated by the Golf Club Committee and appropriate disciplinary action taken in accordance with the Club's Code of Conduct.

KNOCKOUT COMPETITIONS

Entry for these competitions will be via PSi system or HDID.

In Knockout competitions, the maximum Playing Handicaps will be 28 for Men and 36 for Ladies. Members who have higher Playing Handicap may still enter the competition/s, but their Playing Handicap will be capped at the appropriate gender upper limit.

Once the draw is published, it is important that matches are played as quickly as possible. Should a difficulty arise in arranging a match the players must contact the Competitions Chair. If any match is not completed by the deadline for that round and the Competitions Chair has not been informed by either side, then the Competitions Chair will toss a coin to decide the outcome of the match.

No time extensions will be granted without adequate reason and must be agreed by the Competitions Chair.

CLUB COMPETITION RULES

- Competitions scheduled by the Club throughout the year will generally be set up to play in four balls.
- Five-day Members cannot participate in competitions played wholly or in part over a weekend unless the appropriate green fees are paid to the Centre.
- The rules for the various Club competitions are detailed in a Rules folder located by the Psi Screens
- The use of buggies is allowed in all Club competitions in accordance with the Centre's rules at the time.
- Club trophies are presented at the Club's presentation evening.
 Members (especially prize recipients) are asked to make every effort to attend this important recognition event.
- Rules relating to the specific competition being run will be posted on the Pro Shop counter on the day of the competition. Players should always review these before commencing their round.
- From time to time a local rule may be put into place for a specific competition e.g., because of adverse weather conditions.

COMPETITION SCORING GUIDELINES

Scorecard completion and submission

In order to help with the efficient processing of results and avoid any risk of disqualification, please ensure submitted scorecards are complete and clear and signed by both the player and the marker.

A complete scorecard should show the Player's and Marker's names, competition name, date, gross scores on each hole and Stableford points if relevant.

Competition card submission

It is the player's responsibility to submit their competition card into the relevant competitions box beneath the PSi touch screens without undue delay*. Failure to do so will result in disqualification.

No alteration to a score card may be made after it has been submitted.

*'Without undue delay' is defined as submitting a card immediately following completion of the round (or as instructed on the day).

Players' Responsibilities

One of the things that makes golf stand out when compared with many other sports is its reliance on players to ensure that they play within the rules of the game.

The following guidance is provided to help players with this key responsibility:

- If you have any doubt about something you have done, or are about to do, discuss it with your playing partners. It may be that if you are still unsure, you have to decide on a course of action and then seek advice from the Committee after completing your round. Players cannot agree to exclude the operation of any rule or to waive any penalty incurred.
- If, as marker, you believe a rule has been breached, it is your duty to point
 it out to the golfer(s) concerned. If appropriate action is not taken (e.g.
 penalty shots or No Return), do not sign the card, but seek advice, together
 with the golfer concerned, from a Member of the Committee.
- If you know or believe that another player has breached the Rules and does
 not recognise or is ignoring this, you should tell that player, the player's
 marker, a referee or the Committee. You should do this promptly, and
 certainly before the player returns their scorecard.

See R&A Rule 20 for more details on resolving rules issues during a round.

The Committee is keen to support golfers in ensuring that players in club competitions play to the rules of golf and understand that breaches may occur due to ignorance rather than deliberate breaking of the rules. The Committee's position is:

 The rules of golf should be adhered to in all competitions to create a fair environment for everyone.

- The Committee is trying to improve the knowledge of the rules of golf through bulletins and guidance notes issued with Local Rules.
- The Committee can't and won't tolerate a breach of the rules. The
 consequence of a breach of the rules will depend on the competition being
 played (e.g. stroke play or match play) and may consist of loss of hole,
 penalty strokes, disqualification or, in extreme circumstances, suspension
 from competitions.

However, the Committee can only act if notified of an alleged breach.

If you have any questions or observations relating to the above, then please contact a Member of the Committee.

THE MID-WEEK 9 HOLE STABLEFORD CHALLENGE April – September

This 9-hole competition is played every Wednesday for 26 weeks as soon as the clocks go forward. See the fixtures list for the starting week.

Everyone can join in, playing as many or as few weeks as they wish. Each 13week period produces a winner assessed over their best 9 scores with an overall winner over both competition periods.

2's and weekly winners are paid out throughout the period. You can play the nominated 9 holes (ask at the Pro Shop) at any time on the Wednesday. So, book a tee in the normal way, register on the system, pay the entry fee and off you go.

Cost of entry is £3 including the 2's sweep.

It is a great way to break up the working week and to meet other Members.

12. WHSTM 2024 UPDATES

On the 1st of April 2024 the WHSTM Rules of Handicapping & Course RatingTM standards will be updated. Significant updates to WHSTM include:

Course Handicap™ using CR-Par:

Since its inception, WHSTM has embraced the many ways golf is played around the world. To align with other Countries, there will be a change in the way we calculate Course Handicaps so that they are relative to par, making a golfer's target score to "play to handicap" more intuitive.

Use of an Expected Score for a Hole Not Played:

Improvements have been made to the method used to handle holes not played, which will now be based on a player's expected score rather than a score of net par. This new method will produce a 9-hole or 18-hole Score DifferentialTM that more accurately reflects a player's ability. As golfers across the world are playing more 9-hole rounds, an expected score will also be used to convert a 9-hole round into an 18-hole Score DifferentialTM. The calculations used to calculate an expected score, includes ratings of standard difficulty, and are not shared by the USGA. This means the Score DifferentialTM will more accurately reflect the playing ability of the individual golfer.

The Inclusion of Four Ball Better Ball Scores within GB&I:

These scores will be added to the list of mandatory scores to be returned for handicapping. It is vital that all competitions are run through competition software to ensure they arrive on a playing record in a timely manner (before midnight on the day of play). Only scores of 42 points or more, where a player has featured 9 times or more, will trigger inclusion in the handicap calculation. Holes where the player did not score will be allocated points relative to the score recorded on the card.

Enhanced Guidance on Conducting a Handicap Review:

The role of the Handicap Committee is vital to the success of the WHSTM, and the rules recommend that a Handicap Review is conducted regularly, or at least once a year, to ensure a Handicap Index® remains reflective of a player's ability. New reporting tools have been developed to incorporate into the handicapping software to assist Committees in conducting the review process effectively and consistently. These reports will be made available in due course via the WHSTM portal.

Rounding:

As of April 2024, for competition purposes, the calculated and unrounded Course HandicapTM will be carried through to the Playing Handicap calculation using machine precision. For general play score submission, the golfer will continue to use the calculated and rounded Course HandicapTM.

Team Match Play allowance application:

The application of allowances in team match play events has also been changed. Players will now need to work out the difference in course handicaps from the lowest and THEN apply the applicable % to that difference.

Playing Conditions Calculation Adjustments Made More Frequent:

The Playing Conditions Calculation (PCC) within GB&I has already been modified to increase the likelihood of an adjustment for abnormal playing conditions.
